

# Chapter elections

## Why hold an election?

Holding an election will give chapters a chance to bring fresh ideas into chapter future development, help chapters establish strong connections with members, increase the visibility and effectiveness of chapter's long-term development and operations.

## When to hold an election?

Chapters are recommended to hold their elections at the end of a two-year term. Newly established chapters are recommended to conduct their first election within 12 months of the formation of the chapter.

### **Pre-election**

- Chapter committee's should communicate **at least two months** before elections to discuss dates, campaign, nomination process and timelines.
- Advise the Alumni & Advancement Office of details of the next chapter election.

#### **During election**

- Monitor nominations to ensure all details on the Nomination Form are completed.
- Hold a vote if more than one person has been nominated for the same position.
- If there is only one nomination received for a committee position, the person will be declared elected.
- Voting can be conducted via email, or take place at the chapter's Annual General Meeting. The manner of counting ballots can be designated by the chapter.

#### **After election**

Announce the new Chapter Committee and hand-over the leadership as soon as the elections are completed. Notify the Alumni & Advancement Office of election results which should be announced within one month of the election.
