Class Furniture Making – wood work and marquetry

We provide this list of materials as a guide only for you to bring to the School. Your Tutor has compiled this list so you can embrace the class and skills being taught.

All hand tools for woodwork and power tools etc that you can bring will help for this School

Please bring a 60 watt desk lamp (the McGregor School have some lamps available)

Please bring rulers, pencils, tracing paper and carbon paper

Portable fret saw if you have one

Woodcarving chisels any you have

Carborundum or 3m Pac-cut sandpaper – grades 150, 180, 220, 240 and 400

Selleys Aquadhere (Tradesman's Choice)

3/4" panel pins

Sanding cork

Sharpening stone – Aluminium Oxide

Face mask – in accordance with regulations when working with glues, paints, turps, dyes etc

Coffee mug (tea, coffee, milk and sugar are supplied by the School)

Covered in shoes must be worn in all workshops

Kits will be supplied by Geoff. The cost will vary depending on your chosen project and wood type. Please note that Geoff will contact you November 2019 onwards to discuss. Please note the materials list is a guide only and Geoff will tailor the list to suit your project when you speak in November. Please don't buy any tools until you have spoken to Geoff Hannah.

Estimated material cost: Depends on individual project and your chosen kit.

N.B It is advisable to mark your equipment for easy identification

IMPORTANT: **All** electrical equipment required for your class at USQ **must** be 'tag-tested' by a qualified electrician prior to arrival in order to comply with safety rules. Eg: extension cords and hair dryers etc.

HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES AND MATERIAL SAFETY DATA SHEETS.

If you bring any hazardous substance to the McGregor School, please ensure that you obtain a MSDS (Material Safety Data Sheet) from the supplier or obtain one from the manufacturer of this substance. To do this, either ask the supplier from whom you purchase the hazardous substance or read the contact details on the hazardous substance and contact the manufacturer and ask for a MSDS. Once you have obtained the MSDS, bring it with you to the school, and hand in a copy to the McGregor School office, or the Tutor. Hazardous substance can be: e.g. solvents, acids, some paint and glues, chemicals, fixatives, fluxes and solders. If you are unsure, the Supplier and or manufacturer should be able to inform you if the substance is classed as hazardous.
