New Knowledge Broker – First Nations Engagement

Dr Raelene Ward has joined the SQNNSW Innovation Hub as the Knowledge Broker – First Nations Engagement. Dr Ward is a proud Kunja Traditional Owner. She has a PhD in Aboriginal suicides and continues to undertake independently funded and commissioned research, and is also the newly appointed First Nations Director of the One Basin CRC. "I will be an advocate for First Nations People and Traditional Owner groups and right holders ensuring their perspectives, knowledge and participation are integrated by leading knowledge sharing around drought responses, resistance/adaptation to drought and the impact of drought on the



social and emotional wellbeing of First Nations people and Traditional Owner groups,” Dr Ward says.

Lismore Node Manager Amanda Scott starts a new role tomorrow, as the Hub’s Knowledge Broker. Drought about more than rainfall

For a long time, Australia’s standard measure of drought has been rainfall. But while rainfall indicators are easy to produce and interpret, they can be a poor measure of a farm’s prospects, ABARES Senior Economist Neal Hughes writes in *The Conversation*. He says the impact of the drought also depends on the timing of rain and temperatures, and other factors such as input costs. ABARES has developed a new drought indicator, based on predictions of farm financial outcomes. Read more in [The Conversation](#).
